privileges of the states as well as the academic autonomy of the universities. **The numerous times the UGC has amended its own regulations and changed various aspects of the minimum qualifications required for selection and promotion of teachers and other academic staff is ample evidence for the confusion that prevails within the apex agency regarding these norms.** This has created enormous confusion within the academic community regarding the existing pathways for career advancement.

Teachers' organizations in the country have been raising various concerns regarding the existing regulations themselves. However, none of those concerns have been addressed by the draft regulations. **Some of the commission's restrictions are tantamount to denying due promotions to teachers based on seniority and performance.** This will only demotivate the academic community in the country. The insurances on publications and attendance in seminars and symposia, even when such proper facilities are currently unavailable, have given rise to a plethora of worthless publications

and substandard academic exercises. **Teachers are being pushed by the UGC to partake in such seamy enterprises.**

The office of the governor has its constitutional duties and responsibilities. Commissions like the one headed by Honorable former Chief Justice of India Madan Mohan Pundhi have pointed out the illogicality in governors holding posts like that of the chancellor of universities and have recommended that this practice should be scrapped. However, in keeping with the hidden agenda of the union government, **the UGC through its new regulations is trying to foist upon the office of the governor the complete authority of appointing vice chancellors of the state Universities.** This will divest the states of all initiatives with respect to the state universities, most of which are being funded almost totally by the respective state governments. Education belongs to the concurrent list of the constitutions and therefore, denying role to the state governments in the matters pertaining to state universities goes against the federal principles upon which India is founded.

Extreme centralization, like the one that the UGC envisages through its current draft regulations, denies not only the onus of the states but also the autonomy of the universities. Furthermore, it is highly objectionable that the UGC has prescribed punishments for those Universities that wish to retain their identities even within broad compliance of the UGC's diktats.

The All India Federation of University and College Teacher Organizations', therefore, demand the immediate withdrawal of the draft UGC Regulations, 2025 and request the UGC to hold discussions with the teachers' organizations and academicians in the country before embarking on enterprises like this which will have a huge consequence on higher education in the country.

Eighth Pay Commission Announced

Govt aims for early implementation of suggestions; unions likely to seek 3x hike in basic wage

New Delhi (Our Bureau) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday approved establishment of the Eighth Central Pay Commission for revising the salaries of central government employees and pensions of retirees. The revision is expected to benefit 5 million government employees and 6.5 million pensioners, including defence personnel.

“By deciding to form the Eighth Pay Commission in 2025, we have sufficient time to receive recommendations well before the completion of the period of Seventh Pay Commission,” said Ashwini Vaishnaw, information and broadcasting minister, in a briefing after a Cabinet meeting.

The chairman and two members of the commission will be appointed soon, the minister added. The Seventh Pay Commission came into effect in 2016 and its decade-long tenure will conclude in January 2026. (Courtesy : The Economic Times, Nagpur Edition, Date : 17th January, 2025 Page : 1)

DISTRICT UNITS OF NUTA; BYE-LAWS - 1976

PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT UNITS OF NAGPUR UNIVERSITY TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION .

(As required under para 'd' of Article IV of the constitution.)

WHEREAS it is expedient to frame bye-laws providing for the establishment and functioning of the district units of the association and;

WHEREAS it is also necessary to determine the relationship of such units with other organs of the association;

NOW THEREFORE as required under the provisions of para 'd' of Article IV of the constitution, the following bye-laws are framed;

1) These Bye-laws may be called District Units Bye-Laws, of NUTA, 1976.

2) These bye-laws shall come into force after their acceptance by the General Body of the Association and on such date¹ as may be prescribed by the Executive Committee for this purpose.

3) The Association may have the following district units :-

1. Akola District.
2. Amravati District.
3. Bhandara District.
4. Buldhana District.
5. Chandrapur District.
6. Nagpur District (excluding city of Nagpur)
7. Nagpur City.
8. Wardha District.
9. Yavatmal District.
10. Gadchiroli
11. Washim
12. Gondia

4) District unit may be established in such a district where the total membership of the Association is 200 or half the number of the teachers (in that district) whichever is less.

5) For the purpose of para 4, total number of teachers in a given district shall be as is published in the latest Annual Report of the Nagpur and Amravati University as the case may be

6) Each district unit shall have an Executive Committee consisting of one President, One Vice President, One Secretary, One Joint Secretary and Three members elected by the members of the association from that district from amongst themselves.

7) Notwithstanding anything contained in para 6, each member/Office bearer of the Executive Committee of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee of his district.

8) President of district unit, wherefrom no member/office bearer is occupying a seat on the Executive Committee of Association, shall always be a special invitee to the meeting of the Executive Committee of the Association.

9) The Executive Committee of NUTA may make rules not contrary to the provisions of these bye-laws or the constitution of the Association, to facilitate effective functioning of the District Units.

NOTES :- (1) The Executive committee of NUTA, in its meeting held on 29th July 1977 "Resolved that 15th August 1977 shall be the date on which district- Unit bye-laws shall come in to force" (Resolution No. 15 of 1977 on page 68 of 1977 Ex-file. (2) The district-Unit bye-laws, were approved by the General Body, vide item No. 2, in its meeting held on 29th November 1976. (3) These bye-laws were further amended by the proposal, printed on page 40 of 1980 Nuta Bulletin, approved by the General Body vide item No. 29 in its meeting held on 12th October 1980. (4) These bye-laws were originally printed on page 70 of 1976 Nuta Bulletin. (5) and were reproduced on page 4 and 5 of 1978 Nuta Bulletin. (6) further were again printed on page 51 of 1993 Nuta Bulletin and on page 95 of 1999 Bulletin. (7) These bye-laws were further amended by the proposal, printed on page 85 of 1999 Nuta Bulletin, approved by the General Body vide item No. 260 in its meeting held on 19th September 1999 and were printed as amended upto date on page 116 of 1999 NUTA Bulletin. (8) Reprinted on Page 66 of 2005 NUTA Bulletin. (9) Reprinted on Page 88 of 2013 NUTA Bulletin. (10) Reprinted on Page 127 of 2018 NUTA Bulletin.
